SESSION 19 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD MET WITH MOSES

TODAY'S POINT: GOD HEARS US AND IS FAITHFUL TO PROVIDE.

BIBLE STORY

God Called Moses (Exodus 3-4)

KEY POINTS

- God met with Moses at Mt. Horeb through a burning bush.
- God heard the cries of His people and saw their suffering at the hands of the Egyptians.
- God planned to send Moses to speak to the king of Egypt for His people.
 Although Moses was afraid and made excuses, God provided what Moses would need to complete the task.
- The Israelite elders knew that God heard their cries and worshiped Him.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 15:2a

FAMILY READING

Exodus 3:11-14; 4:1,10-14

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How did God help Moses through his doubts and fears? (God provided miraculous signs to convince the people that God had sent him. He allowed Aaron to go and speak for Moses.)
- How does God help His people today?
- How can we respond to God when He hears our prayers and provides for our family?



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SESSION 20 PARENT CONNECTION

A PROMISE FULFILLED

TODAY'S POINT: GOD FULFILLS HIS PROMISES AT JUST THE RIGHT TIME.

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Exodus 15:2a

BIBLE STORY

God Rescued His People (Exodus 12-13)

KEY POINTS

- The Israelites lived in captivity for 430 years when God told them to sacrifice an animal and to paint some of its blood over their doorposts.
- When God passed through Egypt striking every firstborn male, He passed over the households with blood on the doorpost. Pharaoh told Moses to take the people out of Egypt.
- Moses instructed the people to celebrate every year as a reminder.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 15:2a

FAMILY READING

Exodus 12:12-14; 13:3-10

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Why were the people supposed to eat unleavened bread at Passover? (as a reminder of how the Israelites fled Egypt quickly)
- How do we remember the things God has done for our family?
- How does this Bible story give us strength to wait for God's timing?



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SESSION 21 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD'S RESCUE OF HIS PEOPLE

TODAY'S POINT: GOD DOES NOT ABANDON US.

BIBLE STORY

God Parted the Red Sea (Exodus 14)

KEY POINTS

- God was going to receive glory so that the Egyptians and Israelites would know that He is the Lord.
- Israel obeyed God even when they were being pursued by the Egyptians and were afraid.
- God kept His promise to deliver Israel and fought for them against the Egyptians.
- When the people of Israel saw God's power, they believed in Him.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 15:2a

FAMILY READING

Exodus 14:10-14

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How did God fight for the Israelites?
 (The angel of God went behind them; the pillar of cloud separated them from the army; God parted the sea so they could cross on dry land; He threw the forces into confusion, caused the wheels on the chariots to swerve, and so forth.)
- What do these verses teach about God?
- How can we remember that God will not abandon His people?

SESSION 22 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD'S PROMISE WITH MOSES

TODAY'S POINT: GOD'S LAW HELPS US LIVE IN RELATIONSHIP WITH HIM AND OTHER PEOPLE.

BIBLE STORY

God Made a Promise with Israel (Exodus 19–20; 24)

KEY POINTS

- God met Moses on Mt. Sinai to make a covenant with the Israelite people.
- God's covenant was conditional. If the Israelites would listen to God, He would make them His own people, a kingdom of priests, and His holy nation.
- God gave the Ten Commandments to help the people know how to honor Him and treat other people.
- The people agreed to do all that the Lord had commanded.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 34:6

FAMILY READING

Exodus 20:18-24

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Why did the people want Moses to speak for them? (The people were afraid because of the thunder, lightning, and smoke.)
- Are there times when you are afraid to speak to God for yourself?
- Based on these verses, how do we know God's rules are for our good?



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SESSION 23 PARENT CONNECTION

MORE BROKEN PROMISES

TODAY'S POINT: GOD'S PEOPLE BROKE THEIR PROMISE TO HIM.

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Exodus 34:6

BIBLE STORY

The People Worship a Golden Calf (Exodus 24:13–25:9; 32)

KEY POINTS

- Moses went up on the mountain, talked to God, and got instructions for how to build the tabernacle, a special tent where God would meet with His people.
- The people grew tired of waiting and used the offering to God to make an image to worship.
- God became angry that the people had disobeyed Him and inflicted a plague on the people.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 34:6

FAMILY READING

Exodus 32:30-35

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How did the people break their promise to God? (They built an idol, which broke the first and second commandments.)
- What did Moses do to cover for the people's sin? (Moses offered to be held accountable for their sins in their place.)
- How does this Bible story show Jesus in the Old Testament? (Moses was willing to pay for the peoples' sins.)



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SESSION 24 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD IS WITH US

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Exodus 34:6

BIBLE STORY

God Dwelt with His People (Exodus 25:1-9; 40)

KEY POINTS

- God gave Moses instructions for the people to build a tabernacle from the items they took from Egypt.
- God told Moses He would dwell with His people in the tabernacle.
- The people obeyed and built the tabernacle exactly as God instructed.
- God dwelt with His people in the tabernacle along their journey.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 34:6

FAMILY READING

Exodus 40:16,19,21,25,29,32,34-35

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How did the people know how to build the tabernacle and what items to place inside? (God gave them a specific set of instructions.)
- How can we know that God is with us today?
- Who made it possible for us to dwell with God forever? (Jesus)



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SESSION 25 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD IS JUST AND FORGIVING

TODAY'S POINT: SIN HAS TO BE PUNISHED, BUT GOD PROMISES TO FORGIVE WHEN PEOPLE SEEK FORGIVENESS.

Know that the LORD your God is God, the faithful God who keeps his gracious covenant loyalty for a thousand generations with those who love him and keep his commands. Deuteronomy 7:9

BIBLE STORY

The People Didn't Go into the Land (Numbers 13-14)

KEY POINTS

- Moses sent 12 men to scout the Promised Land. Ten men reported that the cities were strong and the men were large, but two men, Joshua and Caleb, encouraged the Israelites to conquer the land.
- The Israelites were frightened and doubted God. They wanted to return to Egypt.
- God sent the people to wander in the wilderness for 40 years.
- Only Joshua and Caleb would be allowed to go into the Promised Land.

KEY VERSE: Deuteronomy 7:9

FAMILY READING

Numbers 13:26-30; 14:1-9

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What was Moses' response to God's declaration to destroy the people? (Moses went before God and asked for their forgiveness. He asked God to remember His faithfulness.)
- How did God demonstrate His promise to forgive people when they seek forgiveness? (God did not destroy the people. Instead, He forgave them and disciplined them.)
- What does this Bible story teach us about God and His love?



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SESSION 26 PARENT CONNECTION

A PROMISE RENEWED

TODAY'S POINT: GOD NEVER FORGETS HIS PROMISES.

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BIBLE STORY

The Renewed Covenant of Moses (Deuteronomy 29–34)

KEY POINTS

- Moses and the Israelites were about to enter the Promised Land.
- Moses reminded the people of all the signs and wonders God had done since bringing them out of Egypt.
- God renewed His covenant with Moses and His people.
- Joshua led this new generation into the Promised Land.

KEY VERSE:

Deuteronomy 7:9

FAMILY READING

Deuteronomy 30:11-20

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What choice does God set before the people? (life or death, a blessing or a curse)
- Moses reminded the people about God's promises and commands. How do you remember God's promises and commands?
- What have you learned about God's promises from this Bible story?



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SESSION 27 PARENT CONNECTION

THE PROMISE KEPT

TODAY'S POINT: GOD ALWAYS KEEPS HIS PROMISES.

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BIBLE STORY

Crossing the Jordan (Joshua 3-4)

KEY POINTS

- Joshua led the people to the Jordan River. When the priests carrying the ark of the covenant touched the water, the water stood up like a wall.
- All of Israel crossed through the Jordan on dry ground. The priests stood firmly in the middle until every person had crossed over into Jericho.
- Joshua chose one man from each of the tribes of Israel to select a stone from the river that would be used to build a memorial to God.

KEY VERSE:

Deuteronomy 7:9

FAMILY READING

Joshua 4:19-24

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- When the priests' feet touched the water, what did it do? (The water stood up like a wall.)
- How did God show His faithfulness to keep His promise? (God fulfilled His promise to bring the people into the Promised Land even when they continually broke their promises to Him.)
- What things help you remember the great things God has done?



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
