

SESSION 19 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD MET WITH MOSES

TODAY'S POINT: GOD ALWAYS HEARS US.

BIBLE STORY

God Called Moses (Exodus 3-4)

KEY POINTS

- God spoke to Moses from a burning bush.
- God told Moses He had heard the cries of His people and chosen Moses to lead them out of Egypt.
- Moses was afraid, but God told him He would be with him.
- Moses obeyed God and returned to Egypt to lead God's people.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 15:2a

FAMILY READING

Exodus 3:1-5 (Retell in words preschoolers will understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Who spoke to Moses from a burning bush? (God)
- What did God tell Moses He had chosen him to do? (lead God's people out of Egypt)
- How do you feel knowing God always hears you when you talk to Him?

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SESSION 20 PARENT CONNECTION

A PROMISE FULFILLED

TODAY'S POINT: GOD NEVER BREAKS A PROMISE.

BIBLE STORY

God Rescued His People
(Exodus 12-13)

KEY POINTS

- Just as God promised Moses, Pharaoh let the Israelite people go.
- Moses told the Israelites God would bring them to the land He had promised to Abraham.
- God led the Israelites with a cloud in the day and a pillar of fire by night.
- God always keeps the promises He makes.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 15:2a

FAMILY READING

Exodus 13:20-22 (Retell in words preschoolers will understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What did God use to lead the people during the day? (a cloud)
- What did God use to lead the people at night? (a pillar of fire)
- What promise of God are you thankful for?



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SESSION 2| PARENT CONNECTION

GOD'S RESCUE OF HIS PEOPLE

TODAY'S POINT: GOD IS ALWAYS WITH US.

BIBLE STORY

God Parted the Red Sea
(Exodus 14)

KEY POINTS

- Pharaoh realized he made a mistake in letting the Israelites go, so he and his army chased them.
- The Red Sea was in front of the Israelites, and they could not cross over it.
- God told Moses to stretch his hands over the sea, and when he did, the Red Sea parted. God was with the Israelites.
- The Israelites were able to cross the sea on dry ground. God rescued His people.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 15:2a

FAMILY READING

Exodus 14:13, 21-22, 31 (Retell in words preschoolers will understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How did God rescue the Israelites? (He helped them cross the Red Sea on dry ground.)
- How can you be brave even when you are in a scary situation? (You can know God is always with you.)
- How does it make you feel knowing God is always with you?

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SESSION 22 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD'S PROMISE WITH MOSES

TODAY'S POINT: GOD GIVES US RULES BECAUSE HE LOVES US.

The LORD is a compassionate and gracious God.
Exodus 34:6b

BIBLE STORY

God Made a Promise with Israel
(Exodus 19–20; 24)

KEY POINTS

- God promised the Israelites that if they would obey His commands, they would be His people.
- The Israelites said they would do what God told them to do.
- Moses went to Mount Sinai. God gave him Ten Commandments for the people to follow. God wrote these commandments on two stone tablets.
- God gives us rules because He loves us.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 34:6b

FAMILY READING

Exodus 19:1-6 (Retell in words preschoolers can understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What did God tell the Israelites they had to do to be His people? (obey His commandments)
- How many commandments did God give the people? (ten)
- How does God giving us rules show that He loves us? (God wants what is best for us. He gives us rules to protect us and guide us because He loves us.)

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SESSION 23 PARENT CONNECTION

MORE BROKEN PROMISES

TODAY'S POINT: ONLY GOD DESERVES OUR WORSHIP.

The LORD is a compassionate and gracious God.
Exodus 34:6b

BIBLE STORY

The People Worshiped a Golden Calf
(Exodus 24:13–25:1-9; 32)

KEY POINTS

- The Israelites thought Moses would not return from the mountain. They asked Aaron to make new gods to lead them.
- Aaron collected gold earrings from them and made a golden calf statue. The Israelites worshiped it.
- God was angry because the Israelites disobeyed His commands. Moses threw down the tablets God had given him when he returned to them.
- Moses asked God to forgive the people.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 34:6b

FAMILY READING

Exodus 32:1-5 (Retell in words preschoolers can understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Why did the Israelites ask Aaron to make new gods to lead them? (They thought Moses was not going to return from the mountain.)
- Who is the only One who deserves our worship? (God)
- How can you worship God this week?

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SESSION 24 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD IS WITH US

TODAY'S POINT: GOD WANTS TO BE WITH YOU.

BIBLE STORY

God Stayed with His People
(Exodus 25:1-9; 40)

KEY POINTS

- God wanted to stay with His people.
- God gave Moses specific instructions for building the tabernacle, a large tent where God could stay.
- The Israelites followed all of God's plans, and they made the tabernacle.
- God's glory filled the tabernacle.
- When a cloud covered the tabernacle, the Israelites were to stay where they were. When the cloud lifted, they moved and took the tabernacle with them.

KEY VERSE: Exodus 34:6b

FAMILY READING

Exodus 25:1-9 (Retell in words preschoolers can understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Who told Moses to build the tabernacle? (God)
- Why did God tell Moses and the Israelites to build the tabernacle? (It was a place where God could stay and meet with the people.)
- How does it make you feel knowing God wants to be with you?

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SESSION 25 PARENT CONNECTION

GOD IS JUST AND FORGIVING

TODAY'S POINT: WE CAN ASK FOR FORGIVENESS WHEN WE MAKE WRONG CHOICES.

BIBLE STORY

The People Didn't Go into the Land
(Numbers 13-14)

KEY POINTS

- Moses sent twelve spies to explore the promised land. The spies said the land was good, but the people were strong, and the cities were big.
- The people were afraid and wanted to go back to Egypt. Joshua and Caleb told the people not to fear because God was with them.
- God forgave them but said only Joshua, Caleb, and the Israelites' children would enter the promised land.

KEY VERSE: Deuteronomy 7:9a

FAMILY READING

Numbers 13:26-28, 14:18-20 (Retell in words preschoolers can understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What did the spies report to the Israelites about the promised land? (The land was good, but the people were strong, and the cities were big.)
- What did the Israelites do to sin against God? (They wanted to go back to Egypt. They didn't trust God.)
- Does God forgive you when you make wrong choices? (Yes!)

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SESSION 26 PARENT CONNECTION

A PROMISE RENEWED

TODAY'S POINT: GOD NEVER FORGETS ABOUT YOU.

BIBLE STORY

The Renewed Covenant of Moses
(Deuteronomy 29-34)

KEY POINTS

- After forty years, it was time for the Israelites to enter the promised land.
- Moses said goodbye to the people. He told the Israelites about God's promises.
- Moses told the Israelites to be strong because God was with them. He wrote down the laws God had given them.
- God allowed Moses to see the promised land before he died.
- Joshua became the new leader of the Israelites when Moses died.

KEY VERSE: Deuteronomy 7:9a

FAMILY READING

Deuteronomy 31:1-6 (Retell in words preschoolers can understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How many years did the Israelites wander in the desert? (40)
- Who became the new leader after Moses died? (Joshua)
- How does it make you feel knowing God never forgets about you?

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SESSION 27 PARENT CONNECTION

THE PROMISE KEPT

TODAY'S POINT: WE CAN ALWAYS TRUST GOD.

BIBLE STORY

Crossing the Jordan (Joshua 3-4)

KEY POINTS

- The Israelites had to cross the Jordan River to enter the promised land.
- Joshua told the priests to carry the ark of the covenant to the water's edge.
- When they stepped into the river, the water stopped. The Israelites crossed on dry ground.
- Joshua told twelve men to each gather a stone from the river. The stones reminded the people that God provided for them as they entered the promised land.

KEY VERSE: Deuteronomy 7:9a

FAMILY READING

Joshua 4:1-9 (Retell in words preschoolers can understand.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- How were the Israelites able to cross the Jordan River? (God stopped the water so they could cross on dry ground.)
- Why did Joshua set up twelve stones from the river? (He wanted to remind the people of how God could always be trusted.)
- Has there ever been a time where you had to trust God to take care of you?

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
